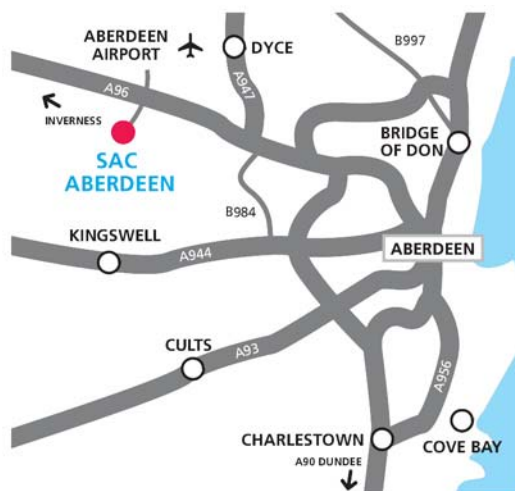

SAC Aberdeen Accommodation Guide

Craibstone Campus, situated on the outskirts of Aberdeen, offers the unique advantages of close proximity to the airport (5 minute drive) and city centre (5 miles), combined with the tranquillity and seclusion of a country estate. Its ideal location allows easy access to the "Granite City" with its cultural, sporting, leisure and shopping amenities, as well as more rural places of interest in Aberdeenshire.

The Halls of Residence are set well off the A96 in wooded surroundings and comprise of three residences situated on an attractive centre quadrangle with cafe, bar & leisure facilities. One of our Halls of Residence (Mackie Hall) is assigned to students under the age of 18.

- Sutton Hall: £95 per week
- Hunter Hall: £85 per week
- Mackie Hall: £80 per week

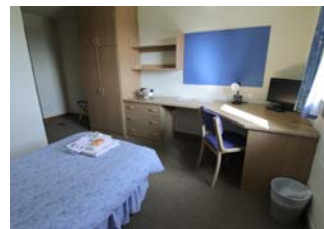
The rate includes provision of a television, the television licence fee, and internet access. Please contact SAC for the most up-to-date costs.

All Halls of Residence have internet access in the bedrooms with Wi-Fi points located in the Mackie Common Room and Craibstone Bar areas.



Sutton Hall accommodation:

Sutton Hall is SAC Aberdeen's main undergraduate residence and offers 60 en-suite single rooms, with shared self-catering kitchens. Three of the rooms have been designed for access by wheelchairs.



Rooms are equipped with a single bed (and pillows, pillowcases, sheets and a single duvet), a desk and a wardrobe. Please note - students must provide their own duvet cover. The halls also offer access to fully furnished dining kitchens and lounge areas.



Hunter and Mackie Halls:

Hunter Hall is mainly used by mature, postgraduate, and international students, while Mackie Hall is used primarily to house students under the age of 18. Both offer single rooms with shared bathrooms and self-catering kitchens.
