Each application to study at SAC will be assessed individually, and admission to our courses is at the discretion of the College Principal, acting on the advice of the Head of Admissions. Entry Requirements

Direct Entry into Year 1 of **Degree** Courses

- 3 *Scottish Highers* (typically Grades BCC)
- 2 *A-Levels* (typically Grades CC)
- International Baccalaureate (IB)
- Avgångsbetyg / Slutbetyg från Gymnasieskola
- Slutbetyg (from the Teknisk Linje)

Entry into **HNC/HND** Courses

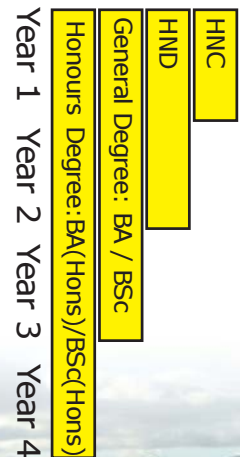
- 2 *Scottish Highers* (typically Grades CC)
- 1 *A-Level*
- Slutbetyg Komvux

Advanced entry into Year 2 or 3 of Degree courses is possible with relevant qualifications such as:

- Vocational Diploma
- Högskoleexamen

Appropriate demonstration of English Language ability, equivalent to IELTS 6.5 for degree entry, or 6.0 for HN courses, is also required.
